2. Cradle to Career 2021 Planning

Karin Demarest reviewed priorities for 2021 and invited Cradle to Career members to share content knowledge related to their area of expertise:

- Access to quality childcare
 - 57% drop in childcare spaces
 - Need to address the hold harmless clause not being in the state budget
- Access to education (digital divide)
 - Change in digital divide definition to mean more than just accessing the internet and devices. It means having basic computer literacy
 - No funds were in Governor's budget to address the digital divide
- Trauma-informed approaches
 - Teachers and administrators are traumatized and need more support and resources
 - ACEs Aware Grant secured by St. Joes. There could be opportunities for collaboration

 - Student voices are now guiding the effort
 - Working on equity pledge and will bring to C2C once complete

- First 5 starting 825 college saving accounts for 2-3 year olds through the Neighborhood Based Services Grant

- Dan Blake would like to explore the idea of using SCOE's mobile learning lab to bring into communities to support educating families on basic computer literacy. This would be in English and Spanish. This would help address the digital divide.
